Anti-Bullying Week 2024 will take place from Monday 11 - Friday 15 November. This year, the theme is 'Choose Respect.'

Anyone can experience bullying at any age, and it can negatively impact our mental wellbeing, confidence and self-esteem. It's important that settings develop a clear approach to preventing and responding to bullying and promote the importance of empathy and respect.
